
We have received letters from pupils in

Year 3 have been part of the 'Farm to Fork' project and went to Tesco to learn about where food comes from and healthy eating.



Stone Age Day

Year 3 had a fantastic time when they took part in a practical Stone Age Day. They worked with staff from an outside company to complete a range of activities showing them what it would be like to live in Stone Age times. In our new outdoor area they cooked and ate smoked trout on the fire pit and they built a mini shelter in the style of a Stone Age house. Also they made jewellery and found out about clothing and dress in Stone Age times. The children were fantastic and asked lots of detailed questions. The next real life project will be in January when Year 5 and 6 will see what it was like to live during World War II.
