Dear Parents and Carers,



We start this term with a new whole school initiative. It is called 'Value of the Month' and the aim is to help children understand more about values and how they relate to our everyday lives. The project began in our assembly on 5<sup>th</sup> January where children talked about their understanding of values. Each class has chosen values they believe are the most important and these will be handed to School Council to collate. Children who demonstrate great effort with the value of the month will be acknowledged in our Achievement Assemblies. Year 4 have already been praised for showing great charity when they had a cake sale and raised £70.55 for Christian Aid last term.

## Year 1 Dinosaur Topic

This term Year 1 will be working with Dr Ledra (a retired lecturer) as part of their Dinosaur project. Dr Ledra will share his expertise and show the children dinosaur fossil footprints, get them to match footprints to the correct dinosaur and share information about how dinosaurs got their names.



### Year 5 & 6 World War II Day

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> January pupils in Year 5 & 6 will be working with Sarah McAllister from the Scouted.ed company to learn first-hand what it was like during World War II. Children will get a chance to make an Anderson shelter as well as cook food using rationing ingredients. Already children have shown their interest in this topic through excellent projects they have completed at home such as powerpoints. We know from talking to our pupils that they love it when history is brought to life!

#### School Nutrition Action Group

Our SNAG group met in at the start of this term to review what they liked about dinners (and dinner times) and what they would change. The representatives from each class were very open and honest in their views. They met with Mrs Slavin from Taylor Shaw to ensure their points were shared with someone who can implement suggested changes. They reviewed the new school menu and talked about what they thought were the positive changes and also which were the less popular meals. Mrs Slavin will be reviewing the menu and meeting again with the SNAG group to get their opinions later this term.
