Staff News

We will let you know when the Early Years post is appointed prior to January so our new EY teacher can become familiar with our pupils and school. Miss Pigg will help to make the transition to the new teacher as smooth as possible.

We are looking forward to welcoming visitors from Guide Dogs for the Blind in Early Years this week. Miss Pigg has arranged for guide dogs and members of staff from the charity to come along and talk to the children. We hope the children will enjoy this experience and the opportunity to meet a working dog to find out all about their important role.

We return to school on Monday 31st October after half term and this will also be the day of our Halloween disco. Children can come to school on that day wearing non-uniform or their Halloween costume if they would like to. There is no charge for the disco which will be on the afternoon, finishing in time for children to go home as usual. If you child attends nursery in the morning then you can swap for an afternoon session that day if they would like to come along.

Earrings in school

Year 5/6 Sports work

This ½ term Year 5/6 are working with a sports coach from the Durham School Sports Partnership to develop team work, confidence and resilience. The first session also included a visit from Alex Dewar, an Invictus Games athlete, to share his skills and expertise in sports. The children work very hard in these sessions and their skills are developing week on week.

Black History Month

We teach Black History throughout October as part of our work on diversity. Learning about this can include English lessons looking at different individuals from musicians to key figures in sports or PSHE sessions. Also, we focus on the positive impact that individuals can have for example, Marcus Rashford and his campaign against child poverty. This national celebration aims to promote and celebrate Black contributions to British society, and to foster an understanding of Black history in general.

Winter Warmth Support

Our Parent Support Advisor Claire Donnelly will be taking donations for clean, nearly new or new hats, scarves, gloves and winter coats to hand out to anyone in our school community who would like some additional warm clothing for the winter ahead.
