### School Closure Procedures

In cases of extremely bad weather this winter we may have to consider school closure. So far, we have not had too much snow or ice. However, if we are affected by heavy snow, we will contact you via text to let you know if school has to close. We always avoid this option but at times it is required. If our school has to close because of adverse weather conditions, any announcements will be made by text and local radio stations i.e. Metro Radio and Radio Newcastle. Please make sure we have your latest mobile phone number so you can be contacted.
