Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the new academic year and we look forward to welcoming all the children back when school opens for everyone to return on Wednesday 2nd of September. Just a reminder that our morning starts are a little different from this September. Children can come to school from **8am** as part of our free morning breakfast club. All children who come along will be offered a healthy breakfast and join their friends in our school hall. We will open our usual school gate from **8.50am until 9am** (not 8.40am as previously opened) for children to come in if they haven't joined us for free breakfast club. Our after school wraparound remains the same as last academic year.

Many thanks for the returned parent questionnaires from last term. We appreciate the feedback we received and it is shared with our governors in our autumn term full governing body meeting as part of our ongoing school improvement. Also, thank you for all your support last academic year and all the help you provide to your child with their reading, homework, bringing in equipment, etc. We appreciate the strong links we have with home so as always, if you have any concerns please speak to Mrs Snowdon, Mr Seaton or your child's class teacher so we can quickly work together to resolve any issues.

Colour Run – Thursday 10th September

Children will be taking part in a colour run in school on Thursday afternoon next week. Each class will get a chance to run around our school field which has been set up by members of the School Sports Partnership team. On this day we ask that all children come in non-uniform wearing old clothes that can get poster paint on them. We ask that children bring a towel in a carrier bag too so they can use this to wipe the colour run paint off.
